Warren Seaborg, basketball coach of the Adams Eagles has been quoted as saying, "We're going to be lousy". We doubt that last years Eastern Division Northern Indiana Conference Champions will be quite that bad, but the Eagles will sorely miss the shooting of Lee McKnight and the rebounding of Ed Butler.

McKnight, conference scoring champ accounted for 554 Eagle points in the 59-60 campaign, and Butler contributed 298 while leading their teammates to a 19-4 season record.

Guard Sam Dairyko, is Coach Seaborg's only returning regular but he can call on three other lettermen, Mickey Stricklen, Dave Stout and Paul Levy.

Center Stout (6-4), forwards Sam Williams (6-3) and Bill Helkie (6-2) gives Adams good height, needed to be a strong rebounding team. Lack of good team speed and experience could be factors in fewer wins in 60 and 61 than in the previous season.

But opponents beware, the Adams Eagles are still the defending Champs, and any team that forgets this could easily go home on the wrong end of the score.

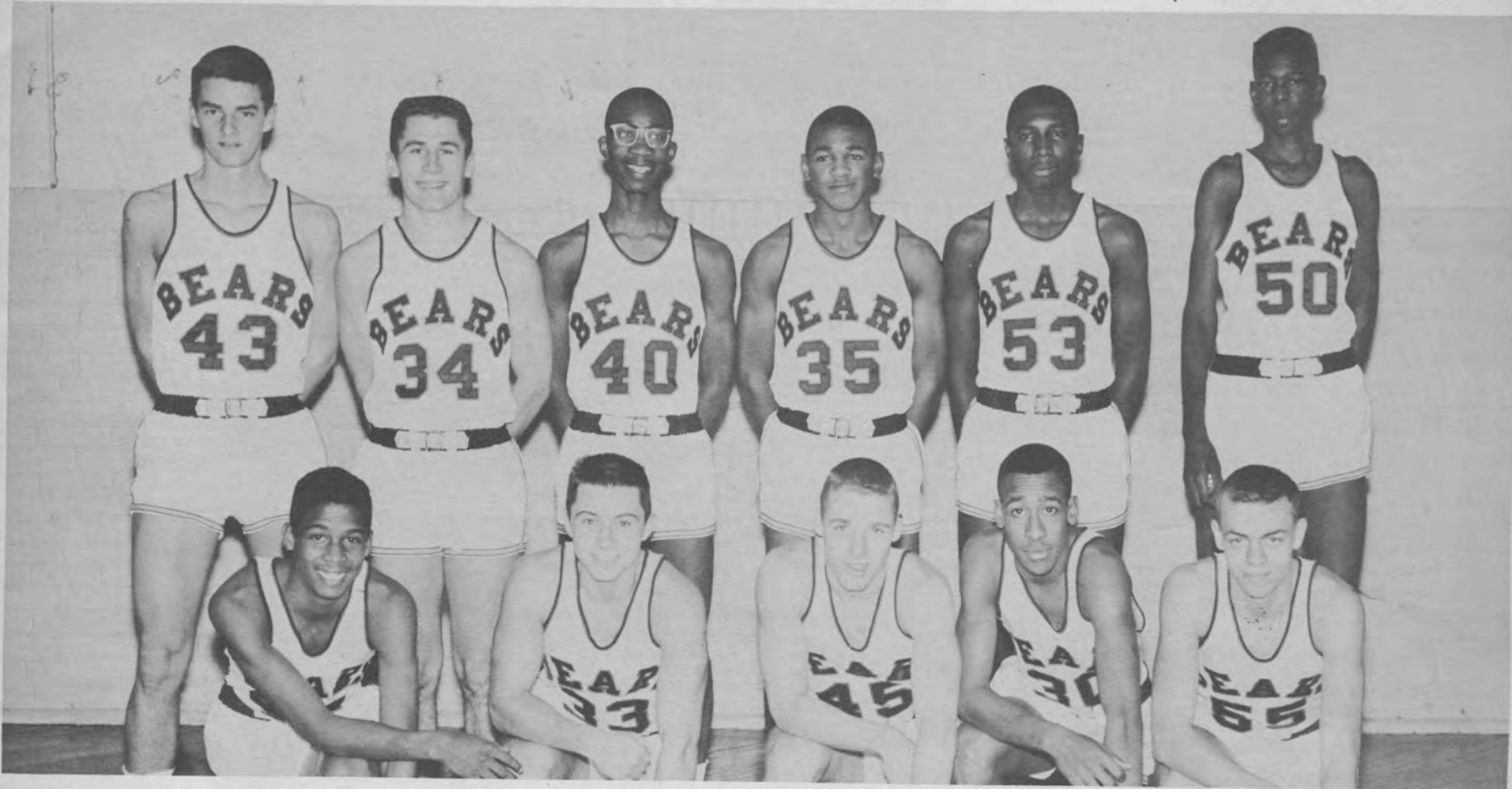

The Bears have two varsity lettermen back from last years squad. Bob Blohm, a 5-9 senior guard who scored 245 points last season and is a very capable performer, and forward Ed Samelton, who as a sophomore last year scored 109 points. A great deal is expected from this young man during the 1960-61 season.

Other players to watch as the season progresses are Dan Allin, a 6-3 senior forward, and Calvin Edwards, a 5-11 junior guard.

If either of Centrals big men, Dewitt Menyard, a 6-8 freshman, or Fred Schulz, a 6-6 junior, can become a steady pivot man, look out for a big improvement over last years 9-14 record.

John Coppens (6-1), Dick Witkowski (6-2) and Jim Pittman (5-10), all were members of last falls Maroon football team and are being counted on for full time basketball duty.

The 14-8 mark of last season will be hard to come by this year with the use of underclassmen and inexperience galore. Mishawaka is a team average in height, average in speed, but has to develop along the lines of shooting and rebounding. St. Joseph's sectional basketball championship squad of last winter has lost a lot of fine high school basketball players, the top man and three other starters, but what's left, and what's coming up will be good enough to make the Indians a better than fair team. The main graduation loss was that of forward Dave White who scored 578 points as he led St. Joseph's to a fine 19-6 season record.

In addition to Dave White, other losses from last year included Tom White, Jim O'Meara, Pat Kintz, John Schneider and Tom Hess.

Even with the departure of last year's talented seniors, the Indians still have many talented boys left. The center will be Al Papai (6-5), Denny Dvoracek a "B" team performer of last year, and Tom Gorski, 6-4 and 6-5 respectively, will see plenty of action at the forward positions, Gus Buysse (6-0), Larry VanOverberghe (6-0) and Dick Donnelly (5-11) are slated to carry the hopes of the Indians at the guard spots.

The sleeper senior is front court man Ken Horvath. There's enough there to make the Indians dangerous.

Only Papai, Buysse and VanOverberghe are returning lettermen. Papai is a fine scorer and rebounder and he will be a tremendous help to Coach Dick Hendricks. Buysse and VanOverberghe represent an outstanding pair of guards, both possess good playmaking talent with neat set and jump shots.
