The bidding opened at 9c. by Mr.

Mr. Cook went 9 1/4c and Mr. Whitton  
9 5-16c.  
At this juncture the President an-  
nounced that there had been some talk  
of adjournment, unless fair prices in  
the opinion of the salesmen were offer-  
ed. Mr. Bizard said he did not know  
whether they could hold their cheese  
better than at the present time. Speak-  
ing for himself, he would not sell un-  
less he received a price something near  
the figure that he wanted, and the  
present bid was not near the mark.  
Mr. Whitton claimed that they offer-  
ed a price higher than was paid on the  
market at Montreal on Monday. Mr.  
Whitton made a reference to the feed-  
ing of turnips, which he said, must be  
stopped.  
Mr. Bailey said that the price offered  
was quite high, considering what  
cheese was going at down east. He,  
himself, did not want to buy any  
cheese at the price offered—if they  
were going to adjourn they had better  
adjourn for two weeks.  
Mr. Rollins said it was immaterial to  
him whether they adjourned or not.  
Mr. Stewart Payne moved, seconded  
by Mr. Smith, that the board adjourn  
for two weeks. This was carried.
