Results of Quantitative Research Conducted among City Residents, Visitors and Arts Patrons Regarding Arts & Cultural Activities in San Antonio

-November 2017-





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Introduction

Background

In keeping with the Department of Arts & Culture's mission to enrich the quality of life by leading and investing in San Antonio arts and culture, the Department commissioned this research to better understand what opportunities exist to stimulate growth and development while continuing to engage and connect with San Antonio's residents and visitors.

The purpose of this study is to gather data that will help guide the City's investment in two key areas, Delegate Agencies and Public Art, in order to continue providing equitable opportunities, maintain an inclusive environment, and enhance engagement and visits.

Research Objectives

- Measure levels of awareness of various venues, events and programs offered by the city
- Understand the engagement and participation levels among the different segments
- Measure attitudes and perceptions of the various arts and cultural attractions in the city
- Focusing in on Delegate Agencies and Public Art, identify opportunities to enhance offerings
- Understand the various segments' purchase intent / participation intent for attractions
- Understand what programs will be successful and sustainable over time
- Identify any barriers to engagement or participation for any of the arts and cultural attractions
- Identify which arts and cultural attractions are underserved, but growing in appeal or those currently not available in the city

Methodology

In order to obtain statistically significant data that is projectable to the surveyed populations as a whole, a quantitative survey methodology was used.

Three population segments were surveyed:

- 1. San Antonio Residents
- 2. Visitors to San Antonio in the past 12 months
- 3. Arts Patrons

Questionnaire

The same set of survey questions was used to survey all three segments. Questionnaire development was a collaborative effort between the San Antonio Department of Arts & Culture and the Arts Community (Arts Agencies). This collaboration took place during a meeting at the Arts & Culture offices where many members of the Arts Community (Agency staff) provided feedback and direction regarding the questionnaire.

The survey was offered in two languages:

Surveys for all three segments were offered <u>online</u> to those who wanted to complete them on a computer or mobile device.

The Arts Patrons survey was also offered **on paper**, in order to ensure those without online access were included.



Resident and Visitor survey participants were surveyed such that the final counts were <u>representative of the</u> <u>population</u> of San Antonio Residents and Visitors based on US Census figures. (Arts Patron respondents were represented by members of Arts and Culture Agencies that chose to participate in the study.)

Residents and Visitors are demographically representative by:

- Gender
- Age
- Household Income
- Race/ethnicity
- Hispanic, Latino or Spanish origin

Timing

The survey was in field for the following dates in 2017:

- Resident Survey: 10/16 11/7
- Visitor Survey: 10/16 10/31
- Arts patrons: 10/16 11/4



Survey Length


The online surveys (Residents, Visitors and Arts Patrons) took an average of 14 minutes for participants to complete.

The paper survey is estimated to have taken about 12-15 minutes on average.



Completed Surveys

A total of **3,002 surveys** were completed: 1,000 Residents, 423 Visitors and 1,579 Arts Patrons.



Survey Participants

There are some differences by segment in terms of origin and ethnicity. (Note that the survey samples of Residents and Visitors were balanced demographically to mirror the population.)

- The majority of survey participants completed a survey in English.
- However, over half of the surveyed Residents and nearly as many Arts Patrons are of Hispanic, Latino or Spanish origin.
- Most survey participants are White, although there are more non-Whites within the Visitors and Arts Patrons segments.

The samples are being modeled to U.S. Census Figures for 2010 as a best practice recommended by Research Now.

Arts Patrons are different from other survey participants in terms of gender, age and their household.

• Arts Patrons are more likely to be female, older and without children.

Executive Summary & Conclusions

The survey methodology was highly inclusive and representative of the surveyed populations.

- The total number of survey responses is 3,002 which results in a range of error of +/- 1.8 percentage points at 95% confidence. This means that 95% of the time we can be confident that the research findings are within a range or +/- 1.8 percentage points.
- Residents and Visitors were balanced so that the demographics of these two segments mirrored the population of San Antonio Residents and Visitors to San Antonio.
- 100 Residents were surveyed in each of the ten districts.
- The Arts Patrons segment includes responses from patrons from 25 different Agencies. The Arts Patron surveys were collected both online and on paper the latter to ensure that those who did not have online access could be included.
- All surveys provided each respondent with the option to take the survey either in English or Spanish.

The populations surveyed, regardless of segment, are highly involved and supportive of arts and culture in San Antonio.


- A strong majority (76%) attend cultural or artistic events in the city once a year or more. Two out of five (43%) attend these events monthly or more often.
- Almost all of those surveyed (93%) believe that seeing and experiencing art in San Antonio is important; over half (55%) say that this is "very" important.
- Most are likely to recommend San Antonio arts and cultural activities to friends and family members (77% give ratings 7-10 on a 0-10 scale - 10=high).





Awareness, interest and participation in arts and cultural events and activities is high.

- Over a third of surveyed households participated in art classes (38%) or music lessons/played an instrument (35%) in the past year. This incidence is higher among households with children: 47% of households with children had a child participate in music lessons/played an instrument and 41% had a child take art classes.
- Seven of the cultural offerings tested in the survey are considered "most interesting" to 20% or more survey participants. (Fourteen different offerings were tested.)
- Slightly more survey participants consider art in San Antonio as "very important" or



"important" (82%) compared to seeing and experiencing art in other cities (79%).

Barriers to attendance at arts and cultural events and activities should be addressed. There are three barriers mentioned by more than three in ten survey respondents:

1. Cost of events and activities (49%)

Selected open-ended comments:

- "More free and accessible programming, not that artists won't be paid, but that groups providing programming have enough funding to pay artists and put on events without putting all or most of the cost on community members."
- *"Free events to pique people's interest and possibly attract not only more tourism but inspire the locals to explore the city as well."*
- 2. Inconvenient times and days (40%)

Selected open-ended comments:

- "More daytime live music events A community driven approach such as a variety of times for shows and range of locations."
- "More daytime/weekend art fairs at various parks around the area where people would be able to gather and see San Antonio's wealth of artists and art!"
- 3. <u>Difficult to access locations</u> (31%)
 - Selected open-ended comment:
 - "While I do feel that we have a pretty good diversity of events for people of all ages, I feel that most things are confined to the downtown area and I would like to have more available in areas that are easier to access."








Many respondents have seen or experienced public art in San Antonio. There are three areas where the most survey participants responded that they want to see <u>more</u> public art.

- A strong majority (90%) of those surveyed have seen or experienced public art in San Antonio.
- <u>Downtown</u> and <u>Along the</u> <u>River</u> are the places where the largest proportions of respondents have seen public art and the places where the most respondents would like to see more.
- Where they <u>do</u> want to see more, and where relatively fewer people have seen public art in the past is in the <u>Neighborhood Parks and</u> <u>Greenway Areas</u>.



Where Public Art Has Been Seen and Where Respondents Would



Culturally-specific programming is important to many. Their interests should be kept in mind when funding new programs.

 More than two-thirds of all survey participants are interested in programming and events that celebrate three specific cultures: Mexican/Latino (67%), Indigenous/Native American (66%) and women (65%).





Differences by segment identify opportunities for marketing and communications strategies tailored to specific groups of individuals.

- Awareness among Residents and Visitors is particularly low for publishing, cultural activities for older adults and classes, lectures and professional development which might benefit from more publicity.
- A differentiating barrier is uninteresting topics and venues, cited by Residents.
- Arts festivals, fairs and parades and music performances are most interesting to Residents. Many Arts Patrons express an interest in theater, while several other items are important to Visitors.
- Arts Patrons are the most open to Mexican/Latino offerings while Visitors have more of a preference for Indigenous.

 Arts Patrons want to see more public art Downtown and in Neighborhood Parks and Greenways, while they and Visitors would like to see more at the airport.


Detailed Findings

Engagement


Attendance

Survey respondents attend cultural and artistic events quite frequently.

- Overall, two out of five attend these events monthly.
- 13% attend them less than once a year.



- Arts Patrons, as would be expected, attend events much more often. More than half of them attend cultural and artistic events once a month or even more often.
- Comparatively, Visitors are more active in this respect than Residents. Over a fourth of Residents do not attend events more than once a year.




Participation in Activities

Many people actively participate in the arts activities offered in San Antonio.

- Of the different activities tested, art classes and music lessons/play an instrument are what survey respondents participate in the most.


- Of the two most popular activities, more Visitors participate in music lessons/play an instrument and more Arts Patrons participate in art classes.
- About equal proportions of Residents participate in these top two activities.







 Among <u>all the households</u> surveyed, adults are most likely to have participated in art classes.



Among those who reported having children, these were the results:

- In the households with children, the most common activity that children have participated in is music lessons/play an instrument.
- A larger proportion of children than adults have participated in each of the activities tested in the survey.



Survey respondents were asked to indicate their awareness of and participation in the following arts and cultural offerings:

Arts education

Offering classes, workshops, educational events or instruction in distinct artistic disciplines, such as dance, music, drama, folk arts, media arts and visual arts.

Classes, lectures or professional development

Presenting knowledge, insight, instruction, or guidance on a specific topic in Arts and Culture, either inperson or online.

Crafts/artisan works

Events for locally, hand-made artisan items and wares, such as pottery, textiles, and jewelry.

Dance performances

Various forms of dance to an audience.

Cultural specific programming

Arts programming and events that celebrate specific cultures like Mexican/Latino, Indigenous/Native American, African-American/ Black, Asian, Women's, LGBTQ, Youth, Older Adults, and others.

<u>Exhibits</u>

Displaying works of art, educational installations, or other items of interest in a gallery, museum, public site, or other visitation-based setting.

Arts Festivals, fairs, or parades

Gatherings which may involve performances, vendors, and other activities, generally in recognition or celebration of a particular occasion, theme, or constituency.

Historic preservation

Protection, conservation, reparation, or rehabilitation of buildings, objects, landscapes, or other artifacts of historical significance.

Music performances

Various forms of music to an audience.

Public Art

Art in public spaces, in any media, that is accessible to all. Includes murals, sculptures, memorials, community art, and creating engaging public places. Can be temporary or permanent pieces.

Publishing books or periodicals

Events for printed works, including paper and e-books, magazines, newspapers, and their internet equivalents.

Theatre performances

Various theatrical productions to an audience.

Art tours/art walks


Offering visits of an organization's exhibits, facilities, or grounds; or of a particular geographic area; to explain the significance, history, or relevance of the collection or site.

Cultural activities for older adults

Offering classes, workshops, educational events, lectures or accessible exhibitions/performances for older adults in artistic disciplines, such as dance, music, drama, folk arts, media arts, literary arts, visual arts and art history.

Participation in Offerings

 About two out of three survey respondents have participated in one of three offerings: arts festivals/fairs/parades, exhibits and music performances.



- These three offerings (arts festivals, exhibits and music performances) have been attended by the largest proportions of Residents, Visitors and Arts Patrons.
- In general, fewer Visitors and more Arts Patrons have attended each of the offerings listed compared to Residents.

Awareness of Offerings

Survey participants were asked to indicate their awareness of each arts and cultural offering. In general, most survey participants are aware of each of the offerings.

- The graph shows the proportion of survey respondents who indicated they were <u>not</u> aware of each arts and cultural offering. The largest proportions are not aware of publishing activities or cultural activities for older adults.



 Overall, Arts Patrons are more aware and Visitors less aware of each of the offerings listed.

- To summarize, awareness and participation are correlated: activities with the highest levels of awareness are also the ones that the most people participate in.
- It is possible that, for some of the offerings with lower participation rates, that the reason for low participation is not a lack of interest but a lack of awareness.




Importance of Art


Art in general is important to most survey participants. In open-ended comments, several survey participants explained why art is important to them.

	Importance of the Arts
	Many people are disconnected from their culture and their neighborhoods - art and cultural activities can help them reconnect.
	There is a cultural significance of dance, music, food, art, and games. Continue to present them in a systematic manner that will encourage appreciation of the various cultural influences that comprise our society.

Art in San Antonio

- More than half of those surveyed consider seeing and experiencing art in San Antonio "very important."
- A majority consider this "very important" or "important."







 Art in San Antonio is "very important" to about two out of five Residents and Visitors. It is "very important" to even more Arts Patrons.

Art in Other Cities

- Similar to the importance of • art in San Antonio, many survey participants also believe that seeing and experiencing art when they visit another city is also "very important."
- Most people consider it "very • important" or "important."




Seeing and experiencing art in • other cities is "very important" to over a third of **Residents and Visitors and** almost two-thirds of Arts Patrons.




Importance of Seeing and Experiencing Art when Visiting Another City

- Comparatively, seeing and experiencing art is "very important" or "important" to most of the people surveyed regardless of whether it is in San Antonio or in another city.
- Slightly more survey participants consider art in San Antonio important compared to other cities.



Barriers

- The primary barrier preventing survey participants overall from attending art and cultural events in San Antonio is the cost, followed by inconvenient days and times.



Q27. What, if any, are barriers preventing you from attending and experiencing more Art and Cultural events and activities in San Antonio?

- Cost is a primary barrier for all three segments although it is a problem for fewer Visitors than Residents and Arts Patrons.
- More Residents also identify uninteresting topics as a reason for not attending events and activities.


In open-ended comments, several survey participants mentioned issues such as lack of awareness, high
cost and limited locations as barriers preventing them from participating in arts and cultural events and
activities more often.



Public Interest - What Do They Want?

Survey participants identified the arts and cultural offerings in San Antonio that they found most and least interesting.

 Arts festivals/fairs/parades is the offering rated highest in terms of interest to survey participants.



Q14. You will be presented with five arts and cultural offerings from San Antonio and asked to indicate which would be most interesting to you and which would be least interesting to you.

 There are some notable differences by segment. For instance, more Residents than others find arts festivals and music performances interesting. Visitors are more interested in historic preservation, cultural activities for older adults and art walks. And more Arts Patrons find theater, exhibits, art education and classes more interesting.



By Segment

Q14. You will be presented with five arts and cultural offerings from San Antonio and asked to indicate which would be most interesting to you and which would be least interesting to you.

Overall, the graph below shows how each arts and cultural offering is rated as either most interesting or least interesting or is not rated either way (indifferent).

- Least interesting are publishing and classes/ lectures/professional development.
- Near 30% favor performance based offerings.




• Survey participants suggested a wide range of other events and activities they would like to see offered by the City of San Antonio.



 Approximately two-thirds of surveyed respondents indicate that they would be interested in Mexican/Latino, Indigenous/Native American and Women's culturallyspecific programs.

- Visitors differ from Residents in that more Visitors are interested in Indigenous/Native American programming than Mexican/Latino.
- More Arts Patrons than others are interested in each of the programming types listed in the survey. Many Arts Patrons are particularly interested in both Mexican/Latino and Women's programming. (A high proportion of Arts Patrons are women.)



Interest in Types of Culturally-Specific Programming




• In the open-ended question about what other events and activities they would like to see, some survey participants mentioned a broader cultural focus and more contemporary offerings.



Locations - Where They Want To Participate

Survey participants rated each of the five areas of San Antonio in terms of where they would like to see more offerings.

- Downtown is the location where the most survey participants would like to see more arts and cultural events and activities.
- The East is selected by the smallest proportion of respondents as the area where they would like to see more events and activities.


- Residents, Visitors and Arts Patrons agree that Downtown is the area where most of them would like to see more offerings.
- Visitors in particular would prefer Downtown to other areas.

Public Art

Public Art Seen or Experienced

Overall, 90% of the people surveyed have seen or experienced some type of public art in San Antonio.

- 2-D and 3-D public art have been seen by over two-thirds of those surveyed.
- A majority have also seen environmental and functional public art.



- 95% of Arts Patrons have experienced public art in San Antonio, more than Residents (84%) and Visitors (83%).
- Arts Patrons are also much more likely to have seen or experienced each of the listed types of public art compared to the other two segments.



Public Art They Would Like To See More Of

Most survey participants (91%) would like to see more of some type of public art in San Antonio.

 A majority of survey respondents would like to see more 3-D and environmental public art.



The most Arts Patrons are interested in seeing more environmental art. • Comparing the types of public art that survey participants have seen to what they want to see more of, more have seen each type of public art than those who said they wish to see more. There is a particularly large gap for 2-D art where many survey respondents have seen 2-D art in the past and relatively fewer want to see more.



Public Art Locations

Survey participants identified all the places where they have seen public art in San Antonio.

- Overall, 96% of all survey respondents say they have seen public art in at least one location.
- The most mentioned locations are Downtown and Along the River.



- The largest proportions of Residents and Visitors would like to see more public art Downtown and Along the River.
- The most Arts Patrons, in contrast name the Neighborhood Parks as the location where they would like to see more. More Arts Patrons than Residents and Visitors would like to see more public art in each of the listed locations.
- Visitors are less likely than the others to name the directional areas: Northside, Southside, Eastside and Westside.




Q20. Where would you like to see more Public Art in San Antonio?


Survey participants indicated which types of public art they would like to see in public facilities, Downtown and in Parks and Greenways. The type of public art preferred differs by location.




Types of Public Art that Respondents Would Like To See in San Antonio - <u>Downtown</u>



Perceptions of Art in San Antonio


• Overall, perceptions of art in San Antonio are very positive. Below are some selected responses to the open-ended question that show how survey participants feel about art in San Antonio.



Perceptions

Survey participants were asked the level to which they agreed or disagreed with five statements about San Antonio's Arts and Culture offerings.

 A majority of survey participants "strongly agree" or "agree" with four of the five statements. They consider San Antonio's offerings to be better than other Texas cities and better than other international cities. They also agree that San Antonio provides everything the respondent and the respondent's family wants.



- The Visitor segment is the most positive towards San Antonio's offerings with over half agreeing with each statement.
- Less Residents and Arts Patrons agree or agree strongly. Most Arts Patrons in particular do not agree that San Antonio's offerings are richer than those of major US and international cities.



Impact of Art on San Antonio

Art is perceived to have a great deal of impact on the city

- More than two out of three survey participants agreed with statement or believe that art connects art and culture to neighborhoods as well as aesthetically improves public facilities and open space.
- Most also agreed with the statement or believe that art is accessible, provides landmarks and makes the city competitive with other major cities.
- Most participants in all three segments say that art connects art and culture to neighborhoods, provides landmarks, and aesthetically improves public facilities and open space.
- Most Arts Patrons also cite each of the other statements as well, in particular believing that art is accessible to the public.




