History – In the early 1930's, the City of Glenwood obtained 16 acres from the Wheeler Family, on which the first ski jump was erected. Then in the early 1940's, town baseball became a top priority and the Glenwood Lions Club got involved. That is when the City of Glenwood obtained 40 acres from James E. Barsness which was a pasture at that time. A grant for the purchase and development of the fields was obtained.

In 1977, the park was expanded to 70 acres. The park continues to grow to where it is today. There are over 4 miles of walking and biking trails. Go through the woods and look for wildflowers, deer, turkeys, birds, or nature at its best. Barsness Park is not only enjoyed in the summer, but can be enjoyed in the winter as well for its cross country skiing and snowshoeing on the trails.
